On Monday, January 26 at 3 p.m., visiting artist Lars H.U.G. will present a lecture titled “My Studio is Where I am; The art of Make Believes—a tribute to *The Dice Man* by Luke Rhinehart” in the Armand Hammer Auditorium at the Corcoran Gallery of Art. Guests are invited to join Lars H.U.G. and Kirk Pillow, dean of Corcoran College of Art + Design, for a special viewing of the 2008 BFA Juried Exhibition and reception in Gallery 31 following the lecture.

After almost 25 years on the Danish music scene, Lars H.U.G. is an established, unconventional, and very popular performing artist. Most recently, H.U.G. has concentrated on his painting, exhibiting in various galleries. He is currently in Washington for the inauguration of Barack Obama.
